

## **Part-Time Instructor**

**Program:** Masters in Applied Health Services Research program (School of Graduate Studies)

**Course:** AHS6004 Determinants of Health

**Semester:** Fall 2024 (September 4 - December 18) \*\*Two sections needed and applicants can apply to deliver one section only or both.

**Schedule:** AHSR6004 is a synchronous online course delivered through Brightspace. Instructor and students meet once a week using D2L online rooms within Brightspace.

**Academic Calendar Course Description:** This course explores the development of the philosophy of the determinants of health and identifies the determinants of health and their relationship with health status. The determinants of Indigenous Health will also be discussed. As the course unfolds, students gain an understanding of the philosophical underpinnings, as well as understanding their inter-relationships. An understanding of the complexity of developing healthy public policy that addresses multiple determinants of health will be developed by students, as well as the consideration of the implications of policy from a determinants of health perspective.

**Duties:** Duties and responsibilities include course preparation and online teaching, course-related student advising, and preparation and evaluation of all student assessments.

**Qualifications:** Applicants should have a PhD in a health-related field (e.g., nursing, psychology). Applicants nearing completion of a PhD program, or those with a relevant Masters degree and undergraduate teaching and/or research experience, may also be considered. Experience in online teaching is preferred. Experience with the Desire2Learn and Brightspace is an asset.

**Remuneration:** Remuneration is in accordance with the Collective Agreement between University of New Brunswick and CUPE 3912.

**How to Apply:** Applications are invited in the first instance from part-time faculty colleagues on the UNB precedence list. Applicants who currently hold a part-time teaching appointment at UNB should submit a cover letter and a C.V. Applicants who do not currently hold a part-time teaching appointment at UNB should submit a complete application (including: CV; proof of academic credentials; name and contact information of three referees; and any evidence of teaching effectiveness) as a single PDF file, directly via email to Dr. Lisa Keeping-Burke, Program Coordinator, Master of Applied Health Services Research Program.
