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Team Member Spotlight: Shelley Doucet



<u>Dr. Shelley Doucet</u> is the Jarislowsky Chair in Interprofessional Patient-Centred Care, Professor in Nursing, and Director of the Centre for Research in

Integrated Care at the University of New Brunswick. Dr. Doucet's program of research is focused on the development, implementation, evaluation, and dissemination of interprofessional practice initiatives across settings and sectors. Her research team develops programs that address the barriers and gaps in services identified through research, with the goal to promote collaborative patient-centred care that is accessible and meets patients' needs across the lifespan. For example, she co-founded and co-directed NaviCare/SoinsNavi, a navigation centre for children and youth with complex care needs and their families in New Brunswick. Her team is currently spreading this innovation to provide navigational support for other populations, including a pilot navigation program for people with dementia, their caregivers, and the care team.
