Department of Computer Science Assistant Teaching Professor

The Department of Computer Science at the University of New Brunswick in Saint John invites applications for a 9-month term Assistant Teaching Professor position beginning August 5, 2024. This is a teaching position subject to budgetary approval.

The Department offers mainly a 4-year degree program in Computer Science with specializations in software engineering, networking, and data analytics. We offer support to UNB's Graduate programs that are across both campuses. Our other offerings are: a Minor in Computer Science, a Certificate in Computing, and a Certificate in Data Analytics.

Candidates for the position must have a master's in computer science with related teaching experience or a PhD in Computer Science (or near completion). While applicants with an interest in any area of Computer Science will be considered, those with training and experience in a variety of areas (i.e., covering a wider range of courses offered by the Department, including Operating Systems and Computer Organization) will be given preference. Responsibilities include mostly teaching, and some assisting in university/department wide academic service.

Applicants are requested to submit electronically (as a single PDF) a complete application package that includes: a cover letter (clearly indicating the competition number and a statement of current citizenship), a curriculum vitae, and a statement of teaching philosophy to:
