

Faculty of Kinesiology Assistant Teaching Professor (8 month term)

The Faculty of Kinesiology at the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton campus, invites applications for an eight (8) month term position. This position is at the rank of Assistant Teaching Professor. The position will commence August 19, 2024, and is subject to final budgetary approval.

Applicants must have a Masters in Kinesiology, or equivalent, a demonstrated effective teaching ability, and ability to collaborate effectively with faculty. The successful candidate will be responsible to teach the following in-class and/or lab courses: KIN 3001 Research Methods; KIN 2252 Functional Human Anatomy; KIN 4383 Physical Activity & Aging; and RSS 1081 Health & Wellness. Responsibilities also include participation in Faculty of Kinesiology governance and decision-making standing committees.

Interested candidates are asked to submit a cover letter, a detailed curriculum vitae, a teaching philosophy, the names and addresses (both postal and email) of three referees of which one should be a direct supervisor, and any other supporting documentation.
