

Data Literacy for Public Servants

To help support the move toward evidence-informed policy, we have partnered with the Government of New Brunswick to develop a data literacy training program for government employees.

With a focus on e-learning, engagement, and mentorship opportunities, our training program aims to

- **enhance data literacy skills to enable public servants to incorporate evidence-based practices into their everyday work**
- **create opportunities for research collaborations between government departments and in partnership with university researchers.**



In April 2020, the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council awarded NB-IRDT and GNB a 3-year \$200,000 Partnership Development Grant to develop and implement a data literacy training program for public servants. The program involves 5 initiatives to promote data literacy.

Data Literacy for Public Servants

The Program

Data Bites

Data Bites is a guided talk intended to engage public servants across NB to discuss how research and data literacy can improve their everyday practices. **In 2021, NB-IRDT facilitated 9 Data Bites sessions with GNB.**

Data Matters

Data Matters is an e-learning course with 5 modules designed to provide a comprehensive introduction to using administrative data. **In 2021, NB-IRDT reached the halfway point in module development.**

Data Connect

Data Connect is an inventory of policy-relevant project ideas connecting university students across NB with GNB to undertake research at NB-IRDT. **In 2021, NB-IRDT's Pathways to Professions students developed a networking framework for Data Connect.**

Data Fellowship

Data Fellowship is a professional development opportunity open to GNB employees to undertake interdisciplinary research with NB-IRDT mentorship. **In 2021, NB-IRDT prepared a job description to send to public servants.**

Data Day

Data Day is an interactive session during which participants from GNB and NB-IRDT will collaboratively use the research process to address a case study on a policy-relevant problem in New Brunswick. **NB-IRDT will use Data Day to showcase program completion in 2024.**

Pathways to Professions

More and more, organizations around the world are turning to data-driven research to inform the way they do business. While New Brunswick's students are being well educated on matters of research, there is still a need for training in applied research in the workplace – something that cannot be learned in a classroom. This is where Pathways to Professions (P2P) comes in.

P2P is a 13-week experiential learning program, developed and run by NB-IRDT, providing UNB students with hands-on workplace experience and training in research methods and job readiness. NB-IRDT has spent the last two years developing and improving all aspects of hiring and onboarding, workshop and tutorial curriculum development, and evaluation processes while providing students with work experience, labour market training, and skills development opportunities.

P2P aims to empower students with job readiness skills and experience in a wide variety of in-demand areas, increasing their marketability in future workplaces and overall likelihood to attain meaningful work in NB. Widening the Research Path

In 2020 Pathways to Professions had only 2 research streams:

BoostNB - Which focused on NB economic indicators.

PopNB - Which focused on characterizing the population of NB.

In 2021, P2P expanded its research stream offerings, keeping both previous streams and also adding 3 new streams for a total of 5 distinct projects:


ExperienceNB - Curation of a community impact assessment on experiential education.

VitalSignsNB - Cost-benefit analysis of physician and pharmacist vaccination legislation.

ConnectNB - Creation of a framework and process for Data Connect: a research project inventory and matchmaking opportunity for research-minded students and government employees looking for students to carry out their research.

New Initiatives

ExperienceGNB - Coming in 2022...

For March Break 2022, NB-IRDT has partnered with FutureGNB to launch Pathways to Professions: ExperienceGNB - a one-week policy bootcamp for NB high school students. Over March Break, student participants will work together with mentors to come up with real-world solutions for relevant issues currently facing NB students. They will take part in workshops intended to grow their workplace readiness skills, participate in networking opportunities with community leaders, and collaborate with other students on a team-based project to be presented to their Government of New Brunswick stakeholders directly.



Diving Deeper - In the Works...

The Diving Deeper series is comprised of hands-on working sessions geared toward learners with intermediate to advanced knowledge of administrative data and research. These sessions will build on the information covered in the Introductory Workshops and provide participants with data skills to apply in their professional lives.

2021 Training Highlights

VitalSignsNB - Funding and Media Coverage

In 2021, NB-IRDT received a New Brunswick Priority Occupation Student Support grant from the New Brunswick Innovation Foundation to employ 6 Pathways to Professions students in the new VitalSignsNB research stream. The VitalSignsNB team, under the leadership of Dr. Chris Folkins, investigated how the subsidization of physician-administered vaccines could help free up resources within the health care system. The result? A potential annual indirect cost savings of approximately \$1.5 million!

The students' findings were showcased at the UNB Health Research Conference and the Atlantic Health Exploration and Discovery Collaborative Health Research Conference, they were presented to the NB Pharmacists' Association in the form of a report, and they were broadcast through local and national newspaper articles, as well as multiple TV and radio interviews. Congratulations, VitalSignsNB team, on a job well done!

Pathways to Professions - GNB

Thanks to an incredibly successful Pathways to Professions in 2021, stakeholders from the Government of New Brunswick asked to form a partnership between NB-IRDT and FutureGNB to expand Pathways to Professions offerings to their own experiential learning students. This partnership has resulted in additional funding from GNB to help NB-IRDT run Pathways to Professions - as well as two additional Pathways to Professions components:

Pathways to Professions: Experience GNB - a one-week policy bootcamp for high school students
Pathways to Professions: GNB - four policy research streams to be led by GNB in summer 2022
