Table 1A above shows immigration status counts for the previous and current study period, with 2022 counts matching those presented in Beyzadeh et al. (2023). It is important to note that each year's counts in Table 1A are based on immigration status as of that year. When an individual's status changes, it is updated in the Citizen Data. Because the "Immigration Status" indicator in the Citizen Data is not longitudinal (that is – it only presents one observation per individual), an individual's previous immigration status (i.e., Permanent Resident) is overwritten by the new status (i.e., Citizen). The notable change in the composition of immigration statuses presented above is partly due to these status updates in the Citizen Data.

Table 1B below presents immigration status counts as of 2023 (for all four years), showing a more consistent count than if results were compared with Beyzadeh et al. (2023) (or Table 1A).

The Citizen Data records used in the previous report had combined counts for study permit holders and work permit holders, leaving study permit holders with a yearly count of “0.” With the updated Citizen Data holdings (presented in Table 6A above), we are able to distinguish between outmigration counts of study permit and work permit holders.

A CMA must have a total population of at least 100,000, of which at least 50,000 or more live in the core. A CA must have a core population of at least 10,000. "Other CAs in NB" includes all CAs with the exception of Fredericton. "Rest of NB" includes all regions that do not meet the criteria to be classified as a CMA or CA. Although Fredericton became a CMA for the 2021 Census year, we continue to use the terminology Fredericton CA in this study, as the change in geography classification occurred during the analytical period.
