1. Organizing teaching around the completion of a final project.
2. Encouraging interaction of cognitive, affective and social aspects.
3. Giving teaching and learning a direction and purpose.
4. Considering student interests, preferences, experiences, skills and aptitudes.
5. Drawing on prior student knowledge.
6. Encouraging the incorporation of a balanced literacy approach.
7. Encouraging literary scaffolding.
8. Promoting collaboration.
9. Bringing variety to teaching and learning.
10. Fostering students' intrinsic motivation.
11. Helping students solve problems and develop strategies in a meaningful and rich context.
