- 2. Encouraging interaction of cognitive, affective and social aspects.
- 3. Giving teaching and learning a direction and purpose.
- 4. Considering student interests, preferences, experiences, skills and aptitudes.
- 5. Drawing on prior student knowledge.
- 6. Encouraging the incorporation of a balanced literacy approach.
- 7. Encouraging literary scaffolding.
- 8. Promoting collaboration.
- 9. Bringing variety to teaching and learning.
- 10. Fostering students' intrinsic motivation.
- 11. Helping students solve problems and develop strategies in a meaningful and rich context.
